Week 1


- On the first day, we were glad to start at 8 AM, as we could get breakfast at McDonald's since we couldn't buy anything on Sunday.
- When we arrived, we received an introduction about the upcoming 2 weeks, had a health check with their doctor, were given work clothes, and received a guest card for entry and exit.
- Afterward, we were split between the two departments we would work in. Robin in intra logistics and Mads in distribution. Distribution was responsible for packing and shipping packaged tea.
- This was done either by packing it on pallets and sending it by trailer or by picking for cardboard boxes and packing in container.











Week 2

- In the 2nd week, we switched departments and tried working there.
- In internal logistics, the company received everything used to pack the tea, such as bags, string, and packaging.
- From here, they also supported production with goods when needed.
- Internal logistics was also responsible for sending tea blends in larger bags to their other sites via an area called Export.







Düsseldorf

- During the 2 weeks, we took many metro rides around the city of Düsseldorf to see and experience it.
- ► For example, we went up the TV tower, walked along the pier, walked in the city center, and tried different food in the city.

- ► Every Wednesday, colleagues from Teekanne arranged company football that everyone could participate in, so Mads joined the first Wednesday, while Robin took a well-deserved rest at home in the apartment.
- We also visited Haribo's factory store in Neuss and visited an old depot that was now used for exhibiting and showcasing both old and new cars.

- After visiting three breweries, we ended up at a restaurant and ate but were very tired at the end after a long workday before that.











Cologne

- Cologne Cathedral was the first stop, followed by a city walk and other activities.












Luxembourg
